OUTLINE OF PROPOSED EVENTS -SA TURDA y -MA y 29, 2004

Dedication Ceremony: The WW II Memorial will be dedicated in Washington, DC at precisely 2:00 pm EST. From 12:00 noon to 2:00 pm, there will be live entertainment (Big Band, Swing, and Military Bands, etc.), video images and newsreels of the WW II era, and wartime remllliscences.

Live entertainment from Military Bands and Big Band music will be provided in Times Square by the USO Metropolitan NYC Troupe. At 2:00 pm, we will broadcast the entire dedication ceremony from Washington. At the conclusion of the ceremony, we again "go live" from NYC and proceed with our show.

The other major components to be considered.....

- .Securing Times Square for the "main event."
- .Transporting WW II veterans and special participants to and from the "staging" and "event" areas.

Key points to consider are:

- .Weather (reports will be obtained from US Coast Guard, NYC) .Screen/projectors/sound system needs
- .Should the event be held inside or outside?
- .What is the contingency plan for inclement weather?

ACTIVITIES PLANNED:

- .A special morning mass for WW II Veterans at Saint Patrick's Cathedral
- ."Live from Times Square" outdoor festivities -12:00 noon until2:45 pm-."Live from Times Square" military and big band music.
- .Seating for all WW II veterans and family members attending with blocked off areas for the general public similar to what is used for New Year's and other events held in Times Square.
- .Large viewing screens throughout Times Square for watching the DC dedication ceremony.
- .Attendance and speeches by City and State officials (i.e., Mayor, Governor, and those political/civic/corporate leaders who are allies of the veterans).
- .Our own NYC dedication ceremony to WW II Veterans to include the unveiling of a plaque and wrath laying service-
- .Active duty and ROTC/JROTC Drill team presentations.

IN ADDITION, THE FOLLOWING WILL BE A V AILABLE:

.V A Services Reps will be on hand to provide information on veterans' resources and benefits. An exhibition on the planning and building of the WW II Memorial in Washington, PC.
