EAGLE PROJECT: ARLINGTON HIGH SCHOOL MARCHING BAND UNIFORM STORAGE

Paul's Eagle Project centered on improving the uniform and equipment storage for the Arlington High School Marching Band. The marching band competes from September into November and the 2012 Season marked the introduction of new uniforms for the 150+ member band. Previously the uniforms were stored on single racks that were large, wasted space and in need of replacement. Paul's project was to design and construct new uniform racks, paint the storage room and to construct a larger, more durable set of shelves.

During the project Paul solicited input from the marching band director, met with a local welder (and former band parent) on the design to identify any concerns, purchased supplies and materials, coordinated the uniform rack construction, room painting and shelf construction.

The new racks nest with each other when not in use, dramatically increasing space within the storage room, and have dual storage bars to maximize storage capacity.
