Wayne Southworth and I went up to Albany, 2/28-3/1 to press current issues onto our Local lawmakers at the state level. As there was a meeting on the evening of the 29th and a breakfast the following morning, we spent the night in Albany. The following morning, we were joined by Dan Morea, and spoke with Sue Serino, Didi Barrett and Keiran Lalor. Topics discussed were the HBOT's reduction in prescribed meds & Rx's, treating PTSD and TBI; Veterans' Suicide rates, Homeless Rates, about 49,000 nightly, have decreased from 6.9% to 3.9% at latest survey; establishment of Veterans Cemeteries in NYS; an increase in Boys & Girls State funding from US Gov't; action on school tax exemption. Some of these issues are new this year. Others are carry overs from 2015, with more information, such as the results from the Hyperbaric Oxygen Treatment.

"We collected at 3 of the 5 stores in 2015, and delivered \$1701 to the Radiothon in the Galleria. This year we anticipate an increase. 100% of funds collected go to St. Judes. This is a volunteer activity. We typically have 2-3 American Legion members at each location. This year, we hope to have Seniors from Ketcham and John Jay at each site. We collect from 8AM to 3PM; the students will work in 2-3 hour shifts. (The schools will make certain that the students receive high school credit, on their transcripts.) We will have water and snacks for the students. The American Legion members will be wearing their uniform caps, and there will be signage displaying our cause."
