Membership Notes

As of the August meeting, we have 54 paid renewals, which is about 54%. As of our June post meeting, we had two new members, one of these is a transfer from NJ. The other is Caroline Pogge, an active duty Lt. Colonel, having served in Iraq and Afganistan.

Ralph Ildefonso, transferred from post 0001 this past winter, passed away on July 14, 2017, aged nearly 80. Two of our members had family deaths, and we all feel these. Howie Yeomans died March 11, 2017, aged 81.

High Schools

Her efforts have provided us with student helpers at our Memorial Day and July 4th coin drops. We have attracted students from both schools for Oratorical as well as Boys State, but we can expect greater involvement, thanks to Kaleh's efforts.

Coin Drops

We have had coin drops for Memorial Day as well as the 4th of July. We have had perfect participation at each of our sites: Flory's East, Stewarts 82 and Convenient Deli Mart. Donations were really fine (over \$2600 and \$1689 for the two holidays), and Ketcham students supported us at all of our sites, both days. July 4th was a new idea, and we purchased 6 gross of small American flags to hand out on the 4th, at a cost of \$28 per gross. We have about 150 flags left, and could have given them all out, with more time---we operated the coin drops from 8AM to about 1:30PM.

Business Contacts

Don and Kevin went to the Texas Roadhouse late last month and spoke with the Public Relations person, Julia Plourde. She and husband Peter, restaurant partners, wish to back the post and all veterans as much as possible. We explained the Legion, our programs, and our use of coin drops to support causes.

Several ways suggested:

- 2. The restaurant is available for gatherings at a discount.
- 3. Julia prepared two gift baskets, containing peanuts and two gift certificates good for up to \$30.
- 4. Hold coin drops outside their front door whenever we choose, as long as we provide sufficient notice.

We may hold our Holiday Party at the Texas Roadhouse.
