Blue Star Banners

At Community Day, the Commander arranged for SignUp sheets for Blue Star Banners. These Banners are roughly 12" by 18", and may be hung by military families in honor of a family member. It's an American tradition to display a Blue Star Service Banner in the window of a home when a loved one is proudly serving in the U.S. Armed Forces. As Americans support troops deployed overseas in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom, the Blue Star Service Banner is a reminder that war touches every neighborhood. The American Legion also offers Blue Star Banner Corporate Flags for corporations and government organizations wanting to show support for employees actively serving in the National Guard or reserve.

The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Capt. Robert L. Queisser of the 5th Ohio Infantry. Queisser's two sons served on the front line. His banner quickly became the unofficial symbol for parents with a child in active military service.

Blue Star Service Banners were widely used during both world wars, but were not embraced during the Korean or Vietnam wars with the same enthusiasm. The American Legion rekindled that spirit of pride in our military men and women following the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks by providing banners to military families across the nation.

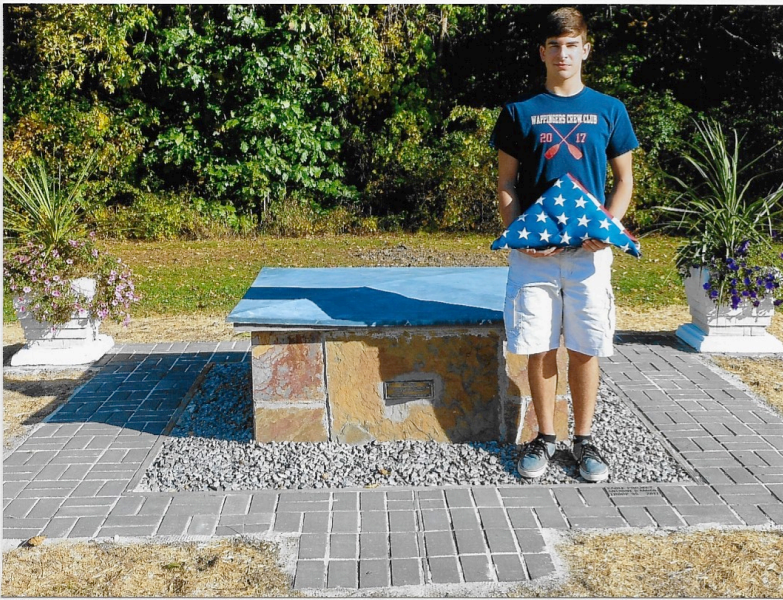
Dear Mr. Hathorn,

The Year of the Veteran

There's a new project in the county. It's called "The Year of the Veteran", and it will be fully developed in 2018. Thanks to a young man finding hundreds of 'glass plate negatives' in his grandparents' attic in Stanfordville, there's incredible interest in the first World War. This highlights 1918, when Poughkeepsie had parades to commemorate Dutchess county sending off dozens, maybe hundreds of young men and women to aid in the war effort, as well as to defend the country.

The project will be presented to the County at the Wallace Center at the FDR Library, in Hyde Park on November 4th. There is a call for memorabilia of any type from that time. Whatever is offered to the project, even newspaper articles, will be copied and returned. All the information will be presented on a series of panels. There will be a "Mobile History Van" offered by Bard College, which will offer displays almost upon community demand.

Groups involved are The Dutchess County Historical Society, Dutchess County Executive, The Division of Veteran Services, Dutchess County Department of History, Bard College, Local Historical Societies, the FDR Presidential Library and Museum.

Signage to show we're here and we're active !
