#### Annual eye exams essential to Veterans' vision and eye health

WASHINGTON — August is National Eye-Exam Month and the Department of Veterans Affairs encourages all Veterans and their family members to schedule their annual appointments. VA is highlighting routine eye exams particularly among senior Veterans. Age-related macular degeneration is the leading cause of vision loss in adults over the age of 60 — a common condition which can blur the sharp, central vision people need for activities like reading and driving. A collaborative study involving VA researchers discovered a group of HIV medications known as nucleoside reverse transcriptase inhibitors may help prevent AMD. ### This month in U.S. military history...

Spanish-American War –

Hostilities between Spain and the United States were halted on **August 12, 1898** following Spanish defeats in both Cuba and the Philippines and the Spanish fleets (in both places) destroyed. Negotiations then led to the signing (in Washington D.C.) of a Protocol of Peace between the two countries and, after over two months of difficult negotiations, the formal peace treaty, the Treaty of Paris, was signed in Paris on December 10, 1898 and ratified by the United States Senate on February 6, 1899, resulting in the U.S. annexation of Puerto Rico, the Philippines and Guam.
