VA designates flexible funding to support homeless Veterans

WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs disbursed \$20 million in American Rescue Plan funds, Dec. 21, 2021, to VA Medical Centers to provide critical and life-saving emergency assistance to Veterans experiencing homelessness or those enrolled in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing program during the coronavirus pandemic.

This Month in Military History

January 1944 Soviet Forces Lift the Siege of Leningrad

Although Soviet forces managed to open a narrow land corridor to the city one (1) earlier on January 18 1943, the Red Army did not lift the German Wehrmacht's (and Finnish Army's) siege of Leningrad until January 27, 1944, a full 872 days after it began. The blockade became one of the longest and most destructive sieges in history, and it was possibly the costliest siege in history due to the number of casualties which were suffered throughout its duration. In the 21st century, some historians have classified it as a genocide due to the systematic starvation and intentional destruction of the city's civilian population.
