New Veterans Memorial Park coming to East Fishkill

Coming to the town of East Fishkill is the new Veterans Memorial Park. The park is located off Route 376, near the East Fishkill Town Hall. The park will include a Memorial Garden, Flag Ceremony Plaza, Memorial Plaza, Donor Walk, Gold Star Plaza, and a water feature.

"We started a Veterans Memorial Committee with our Veterans Council. The (East Fishkill) Town Board allocated funds to hire an architect to design a new park. This has been adopted by the board," said East Fishkill Supervisor Nick D'Alessandro.

"The surveying of the property and drawing up some of the initial plans is the first stage of construction. Hopefully the highway department will do some of the grading. Stated D'Alessandro.

The supervisor said groundbreaking at this time is expected to occur in Spring 2024 with town officials "looking to do as much work in-house as possible.

Fundraising is being done, said D'Alessandro. Town officials recently sent a brochure about the park to corporations such as Pepsi Co and Amazon, which have facilities in East Fishkill seeking donations said D'Alessandro. A \$150,000 check from a corporation will be used towards the five-acre park, he explained. "We have a very small Veterans Memorial Park at Beekman Road and Route 82. It's a tough configuration there and a bit dangerous when we hold our Memorial Day Ceremony there" stated the supervisor. "We want something truly befitting of our veterans".

"American Legion Post 1758 and all East Fishkill veterans and their families are looking forward to the new East Fishkill Veterans Park. The existing small park at the intersection of Route 82 and Beekman Road was established decades ago when East Fishkill was a rural farming community with little traffic along those roads. The current Memorial Park is small and it's difficult to have a memorial service or a quiet place to honor and remember our veterans due to the volume of passing traffic," said Jim Reynolds, Manny Bacon Post 1758 Commander.

As for the feedback town officials have received from the town residents and veterans, D'Alessandro said, "We have received tremendously positive words of feedback from the community. They're so happy and engaged." He noted town officials have received so many emails and calls praising the project.

"They're proud that we're doing this" he said.

"The park will be a tribute to the men and women who have served and those continuing to serve in the United States military. It will be a place set aside to honor, remember, and reflect on those who have served. Within the park will be a memorial garden with benches where friends and family can spend quiet moments remembering those veterans who we have lost. It's important to remember our past and a teaching "walking path" with reminders of past conflicts will provide that history. Ample parking will be available, something we do not have currently. Personalized pavers will lead to the American Flag and service flags which will be the focal point of the park. Hometown hero banners will be on display year around," said Reynolds


In 2022, a Dutchess County microgrant for \$15,000 was given for "building a war monument that will complement the town's new Veterans Memorial Park and will help represent the commitment and sacrifices performed by servicemembers."

Reynolds remarked, "The park will serve as a place of solemn point repose for veterans, their families, and loved ones to honor fallen brethren and members. It's time that we really honor Charles "Manny" Bacon, William Wright, Raynard Hansen, Eugene Gamba, and all the other veterans of East Fishkill who have served throughout the years."

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced two burial updates for service members who have been missing and unaccounted for from World War II and the Korean War. Returning home for burial with full military honors are:

--Army Cpl. R. V. Leo Short, 19, of Seminole, Oklahoma, was a member of George Company, 2nd Battalion, 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division, Eighth U.S. Army. He died while a prisoner of war in March 1951. He will be buried in his hometown on Dec. 9, 2023.


-- Army Air Force Sergeant White S. Goings Jr., 22, of Auburn, Nebraska, was a member of the 93rd Bombardment Squadron, 19th Bombardment Group. He died while a prisoner of war on July 19, 1942. He will be buried in his hometown in June 2024.


